

The perpetual humidity of the air leads to changeable skies, forming in one day more magic images than the eye can absorb. Infinite and deserted, the area allows you to welcome an invasion of silence and where the passing of time becomes an art of living.

The innovative and harmonious design proposes the same style of page-turning as for a calendar and beautifully renders the powerful expression of the panoramic photographs which stretch across the width of the book (38cm) without interruption. The texts are bilingual (French and English) and are designed with the intention to please and to inform. The photographs of the places visited, located on dedicated maps, are an invitation to easily approach the beauty of the areas frequented daily by the Scots.

Since 1989, Hervé has travelled through Scotland in search of the unusual angles and fleeting light which momentarily reveal the latent beauty of our surroundings. The format and quality of Hervé's photos encourage a closer look at daily scenes and a greater awareness of the need for conservation. Hervé regularly presents his work in exhibitions and lectures (www.panoramart.com). In 2006, he begins a new activity as independent publisher.




Auld Alliance

The presence of numerous French words in the Scottish language reminds us that for centuries, Scotsmen and Frenchmen lived in symbiosis. In the XVIth century, they had the same passport and the Scot always evokes the Auld Alliance, which the French has very often heard nothing about. The Auld Alliance, the oldest European treaty according to General de Gaulle, was indeed officially concluded between both countries in 1295; however, the association dates back credibly to Charlemagne. Although this came to an end four centuries ago, intellectual and artistic exchanges have since continued.
